- In core reading this week the Green Group delved deeper into their science fiction novel. Tom has caught up with his friend Coxie and now they are discussing the issue with 'Wet Suit Man' and the possibility that someone else may hold another set of time travelling medallions. The Purple Group did some research on native African marine species as Martine is now aboard the Sea Kestral. We all agreed that her prophecy hasn't come true even though Martine believes that the shark encounter with Norm was it. A big adventure lies ahead! - We wrote letters to local signage companies this week. We have had a

- We continued to work on time durations this week. The Wildcats had to calculate complex addition and subtraction time sums. The Red squirrels had to read timetables accurately and calculate the elapsed time. The Ospreys continued to reinforce their understanding of converting between 12 hour and 24-hour time, as well as calculating time durations.
- We had our first music session with Liza this week. Pupils thoroughly enjoyed her session, especially the musical games.

- During topic this week pupils learnt about John Muir and the important work
 he did. They then started to research a native Scottish species of their choice.

- We continued with our creative writing in the woods on Thursday afternoon. Pupils were asked to choose a natural item from the woods whilst on a quiet stroll. We then sat together on the Big Hill and created fictional stories about the natural item that had intrigued us. As we are quite loud class, I wanted to teach them how to be inconspicuous, so that they can learn to appreciate their natural surroundings. We played a game called, 'Disappearing into the Woods' They really enjoyed this challenge and it paid off as we all got to enjoy watching a Red squirrel running around a tree.
- Group 3 lead their P.E session on Thursday and it was hugely successful. The group were adaptable to the classes needs and were able to keep them engaged throughout, whilst having fun!
- We had our second Gaelic session today focusing on numbers and weather. We enjoyed the games.
