During this week's reflection, pupils shared what they have enjoyed this week. Here is a summary of their comments:

- Making paper aeroplanes, measuring their angles and measuring their distance and flight time.

- Completing the problem-solving challenges.
- Going round the woodland with Miss Guthrie to prepare for our 'Walk and Talk' community event.

This week ...

- On Monday we had our Sports Day. The sun was shining and everyone was super excited to participate. Pupils enjoyed the potted sports events and also liked the running races. We especially liked the P7 race, there were some funny outfits running down the pitch!
- As a follow up, pupils designed a beautiful frame and chose their favourite photo from Sports Day to place in their design.
- We continued with music on Tuesday and I was over the moon to hear the compositions. Pupils are playing to the beat and listening to each other throughout the song.
- We played restaurant in French this week. We learnt key phrases required to enable
 them to ask and order from a menu. Usually they love drama, but this one challenged
 them a bit. We will definitely practise this again next week. Later in the week we
 played Linguascope Live which was a great opportunity to learn the names of fruit and
 vegetables in French, as well as destroying the dragon!
- The Purple Group enjoyed creating a fact file about the Man 'o' War this week. We all learnt some incredibly interesting facts about this phenomenally weird creature. Claudius has survived the Man 'o' War attack, thanks to Ben and Martine and the final phase of the prophecy is underway. The Green Group completed a brilliant character profile on all the main characters this week and summarised the connections between each character. They worked together magnificently! They have discovered that Tom is in a hospital, in the future, and we hope he gets cured from nerve-burn.
- We worked on calculating time differences this week through worded problems. The
 Wild cats continued with their problem-solving task. I was impressed to see pupils
 working together, sharing strategies to find the answer. Pupils demonstrated a patient
 approach and used their critical thinking skills to complete the task.
- On Thursday we took numeracy and science outdoors. Pupils learnt about aerodynamics and worked in pairs to make streamlined paper aeroplanes. We then timed and measured how far each plane flew and marked them on a scatter graph. We decided that it would be useful to continue with this exercise, looking at different data next week.
- In Health we discussed consent again, focusing on our body. Pupils discussed consent issues in scenarios provided. We watched a "really cheesy" song about the importance of body autonomy.
- Pupils thoroughly enjoyed the House Treat on Thursday afternoon. We enjoyed a
 superb picnic, prepared by our lovely canteen staff. Later, pupils enjoyed a well-earned
 ice-cream. We had a variety of sporting activities and pupils happily participated in
 activities of their choice. It was a great opportunity for pupils to chat and play sport
 with pupils from other classes.
- Our final Young Leaders group lead their P.E session this week with the Yellow Room.
 It was another super session and the P1/2 pupils were really engaged.
- The biggest highlight for me has been our informative boards. I would like to say a massive thank you to James Craig for installing our boards around our local woodland. My class held a Community Event today hosting a 'Walk and Talk' around the woods. Pupils introduced their boards and shared important facts about the native species found within our woodland. I am so proud of the class and their hard work is evident in their beautiful boards. Well done P6.
