Achievements

During this week's reflection, pupils shared what they have learnt this week. Here is a summary of their comments:

- We have learnt that centipedes are carnivorous and millipedes are detritivores.
- We learnt about endangered species this week. 97% of the water vole population has gone down since 1970. We also enjoyed researching endangered species.
- We've learnt that there are several colours for Candy-striped spiders.
- We learnt that scientists use quadrats to study a specific area.
- We learnt how to set out a frequency table and use our results to put in an accurate bar chart. We also did this in the woods.
- We learnt how to manage a woodland, catering for tourism and a local café.

This week ...

- On Tuesday we revisited food in French. We practised asking each other if we liked certain foods and then introduced drinks in French. Pupils then played a dice game. Pupils had to roll the die and collect a dish from each number. The first person to have all dishes won.
- Pupils adopted the role of a Woodland Officer on Tuesday. As Woodland
 Officers, pupils had to work collaboratively to develop and manage an area to
 ensure that biodiversity needs were met whilst raising awareness and
 bringing in an income for the local area. Pupils created map drawings with a
 key and confidently presented their management plans. I was really
 impressed observing them using their co-operative skills with their peers to
 create a successfully maintained and sustainable woodland.
- We analysed newspaper reports on Wednesday in preparation for our writing this week. Pupils had to determine the key points of the text and analyse how successful the introduction was. We spent some time highlighting the proper nouns in the text and assessed key vocabulary used within the text.
- The school nurses visited our class on Wednesday to talk about our body and hygiene. My class listened superbly and answered questions confidently.
- On Thursday we revisited our discussion about endangered species in Scotland. Each pupil picked a species of their choice to research. They were asked to take notes about their chosen species, including information about where it is found, reasons for it's decline and ways to support and protect the species.
- Later on Thursday afternoon we started our newspaper report. All pupils have written a powerful headline and a detailed introduction, ensuring they had all 5ws. All reports also have a beautifully designed picture of their chosen species accompanied by a caption.
- The weather was amazing for outdoor learning this week. We focused on science and maths this week. We took magnifying glasses, magnifying pots and pooters into the woods so we could get close to the illusive bugs. Each group placed a large hoop in an area of their choice to act as a quadrat. Plant and animal species were investigated and identified within their area. They absolutely loved using the pooters and looking at the bugs in our 2-way magnifying pots. Afterwards, we continued with information handling. We expanded our area and surveyed the number of different species of trees. In their small groups they had to create their findings in a bar chart using natural materials. We had one group use a pine cone to represent the value of two going up the y-axis and a leaf from each tree along the x-axis. Pupils were able to represent the number of trees using sticks and pine cones. All photos are on the Google classroom.
- On Friday we had another group lead P.E in the Yellow Room.
